Student Community Service Hours

Giving back to the community is a wonderful way to be involved and a requirement to be eligible for end of the year awards for grades 3 through 8. Community service requirements are as follows:

3rd Grade 10 hours	5th Grade 20 hours	7th Grade 30 hours	NJHS Students + 10 hours
4th Grade 15 hours	6th Grade 25 hours	8th Grade 35 hours	

Students are responsible for tracking and logging their hours on the Community Service Record form which details the location, date, activity, times worked, and Supervisor Signature (no parent signatures please).

Community Service Record forms get submitted to Ms. Amanda in the front office. Some suggestions are (but are not limited to) donating your time/services to : Upper Keys Humane Society, Founders Park, Wild Bird Sanctuary, neighborhood clean up, Rotary Events, Convalescent Center, Car Wash for charity, make cards for the elderly, donate old clothes, launch a recycling competition, Habitat for Humanity.

Parent Information/Volunteer Hours

The school encourages active parent involvement in all aspects of their child's education. Parent involvement provides support to the inspiration that inspires a love of learning. The school requires that parents, grandparents, legal guardians and/or friends of students volunteer 15 hours per family, per academic year. Projects may include but are not limited to participation in field studies, making materials for the classrooms, volunteering as a reading listener or a room parent, attending parent education nights and/or board meetings, fundraising, attending fundraising events and serving on the public relations or other committees. As part of the volunteer program, each person who participates directly with students must enroll in RAPTOR. This Monroe County School District program is designed for the protection of our students. Registration in Level II is for volunteers who will chaperone, transport students, and engage in student-related activities. Level II requires that the volunteer be fingerprinted through the county school system. An application can be made by logging onto the County's web site at www.KeysSchools.com If volunteering during school hours is not possible, there are plenty of opportunities that can be done at home during evening or weekend hours.
